Texas Tech Men and Jayhawk Women Take Home Championship Soccer Trophies

Manhattan, Kan. — The University of Kansas women’s club soccer team celebrated as champions here Sunday at the 38th Annual K-State Ed Chartrand Memorial Soccer Tournament.

The Jayhawk women won the top prize in a 1-0 decision over Texas A&M 1-0, after earlier weekend victories over Truman State and K-State.

Hannah Kwapiszeski, Kansas University player from Overland Park, Kan., was named tournament MVP in the women’s bracket.

In the men’s bracket, the Texas Tech “red team” beat the Kansas University men’s team 5-1 to claim the tournament’s other championship trophy. Two Texas Tech men’s teams — “red” and “black” — competed in the weekend-long tournament. Texas Tech won the finale after earlier victories against Ball State, Central Michigan, and K-State.

Jakob Arney of the Texas Tech Red Team, was named tournament MVP in the men’s bracket.

The tournament was founded in memory of Edward E. "Fast Eddy" Chartrand, a former K-State soccer player from Leawood, Kan., who died in 1979 the night before his graduation from K-State. He was 22. The Chartrand Charitable Foundation and private donors provide financing for the tournament and its scholarship program.
